

Trapshooting

Revised November 2019

Refer to the 55+ BC Games 'General Rules Book' for general rules that apply to all sports.

1. Age Categories

Men 55-64, 65-74, 75+

Women 55+

2. Events

Singles event on Thursday

Handicap event on Friday

3. Participation

- a) Each zone may send an unlimited number of participants

4. Competition

- a) Official rules of Pacific International Trapshooting Association (PITA) shall apply **with 55+ BC Games exceptions.**
- b) **The Host Society Sport Chair will post schedules, draws and results at the venue throughout the competition.**
- c) Local rules for safe gun handling are posted and followed. Range officers will always be present.
- d) Singles event will shoot from the 16-yard line.
- e) In the singles event there are 4 classes based on previous shooting averages, to provide fair separation between new and experienced participants in A, B, C and D. The **Host Society Sport Chair** will determine the classes based on the shooting averages of the participants. If a new participant, the **Host Society Sport Chair** will determine which class is appropriate.
- f) The handicap event separates participant's ability into 3 yardage groups 19-21 (short), 22-24 (mid) and 25-27 (long) yards. PITA official rules are used to determine ability. The **Host Society Sport Chair** will determine the yardage group based on the shooting averages of the participants.

5. Medals

- a) Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded for high overall (HOA) combined top scores in the four classes and three men's age categories. High overall combined scores will be awarded to the top three women.
